What motivated you to join Toastmasters?

My job involves interacting with customers, presenting to large audiences and customers. I felt the need to improve my communication skills and one of my colleagues recommended Toastmasters. I attended a few meetings as a shy guest and then joined Toastmasters.

What advice do you have for your fellow Toastmasters?



Prepare and practice thoroughly before each meeting. Sign up

for a speech or a role or volunteer in table topics. Take each role or speech seriously by preparing and practicing and you will become a good speaker. The amount of practice and effort you put in will reflect in your speeches. "What you sow is what you reap."

For the first 3 years after I joined Toastmasters, I did not invest time and did not practice before the meeting and, thus, I did not get much out of Toastmasters. I just came in, delivered 5 speeches and stopped. I did not participate actively, although I turned up for a meeting here and there. After a gap of a few years, my mentor David Betowski tapped on my shoulders to work on my Competent Communicator manual. I started giving prepared speeches again but this time with great enthusiasm. I prepared and practiced well and my speeches were well-received. I completed my Competent Communicator manual. I entered Humorous speech contest by coincidence but I worked to put together and deliver a good speech. I even won the Area Contest, and winning the Area Contest was a great confidence booster. It reassured me that I will need to take more opportunities to speak and practice more to get better at public speaking.
